

**CREAR Futuros**, which means "To Create Futures" in Spanish, is a national peer-mentor based initiative funded by the Hispanic Federation, Inc., designed to promote Latino student success at partner colleges and universities around the nation. The University of Central Florida (UCF) is a proud partner!

**CREAR Futuros** (College **RE**adiness, **A**chievement and **R**etention) provides an opportunity for incoming freshmen and new transfer students at UCF to position themselves on a path to success!

**Creyentes** (Mentees) are paired with knowledgeable and highly trained upper-classman peer-mentors that introduce them to campus resources and offer insight on how to leverage campus resources.

This competitive program provides participants with professional development opportunities and access to a wide range of support services.

### Who is Involved?

All students of any background who are interested in supporting Latino student success are eligible to apply. Mentors must have Junior/Senior standing, a 3.3+ overall cumulative UCF GPA and a proven leadership track record. Applications are available every spring semester.
