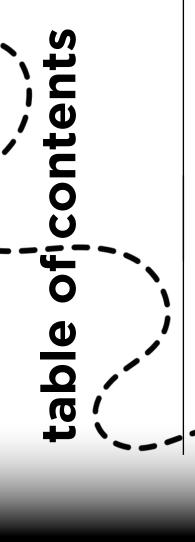

Keynote Speakers L. Trenton S. Marsh, Ph.D

L. Trenton S. Marsh, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor in the Learning Sciences and Educational Research department at the University of Central Florida. His interdisciplinary work focuses on understanding the experiences of historically marginalized students and confronting disproportionality in education. He works alongside youth and their communities to reimagine and inform both practices and policies.

Dr. Marsh received the "Spirit of Innovation" award at the UCF/Valencia Downtown campus and most recently was named New York University's 2025 Spirit of Steinhardt Ascending Champion, the second highest award given out at Steinhardt. Dr. Marsh is also the recipient of the 2025 Volunteer of the Year for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central Florida for creating the Healing Oasis for Peace and Empowerment® (H.O.P.E.) Circle. In partnership with the Levy-Hughes Club in the historic Parramore community, H.O.P.E. amplifies the concerns of young people and fosters a space to work alongside young people to discover transformative solutions.



Dr. Marsh's research has been funded by the National Science Foundation-Civic Innovation Challenge, the American Physical Society, the American Psychologi-

cal Association (Division 15- Educational Psychology), UCF Downtown, and the Orlando Magic Youth Foundation. He has published his interdisciplinary research widely, some include Teachers College Record, Urban Review, Education Week, Progress in Disaster Science, American Association of Physics Teachers, and Urban Education. Before his academic career, Dr. Marsh was a Managing Business Consultant at IBM Corporation for nearly a decade. He is inspired daily by his wife of 12 years and his three sons; and thankful to his Lord and Savior Jesus for the gift of life



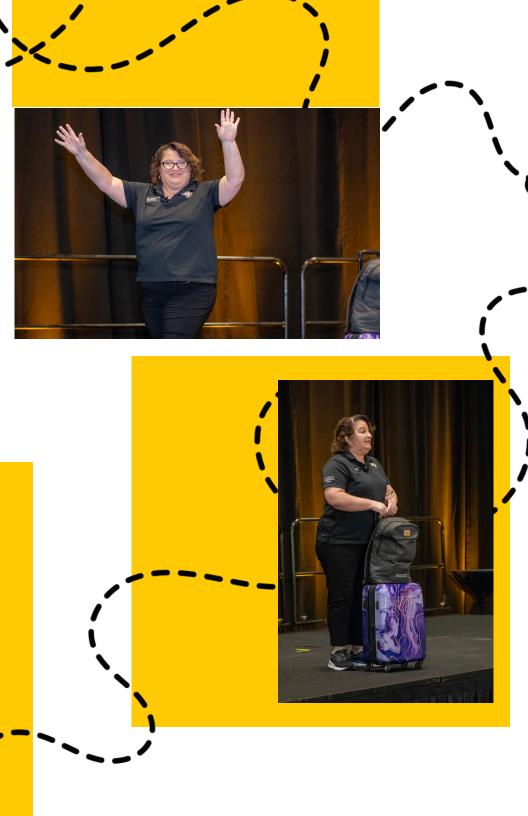
Dr. Adrienne Frame

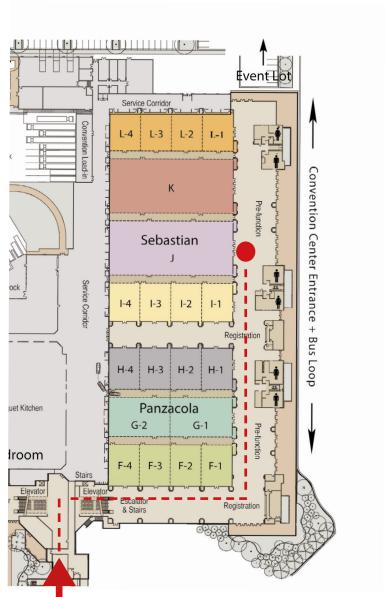

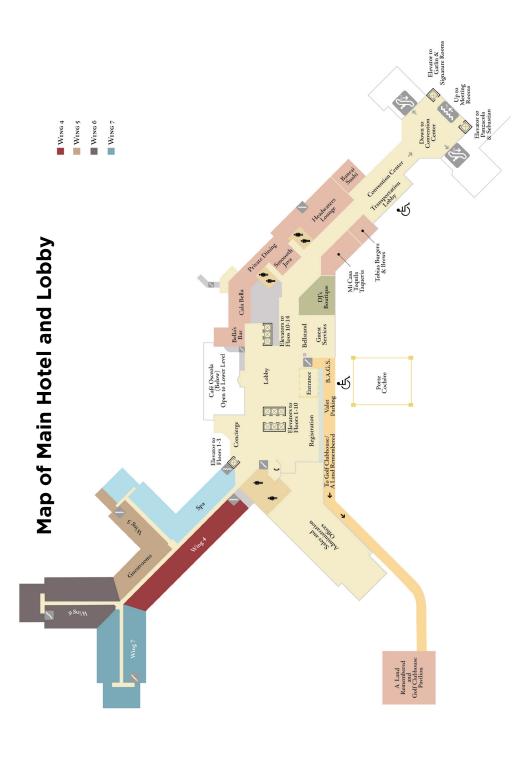


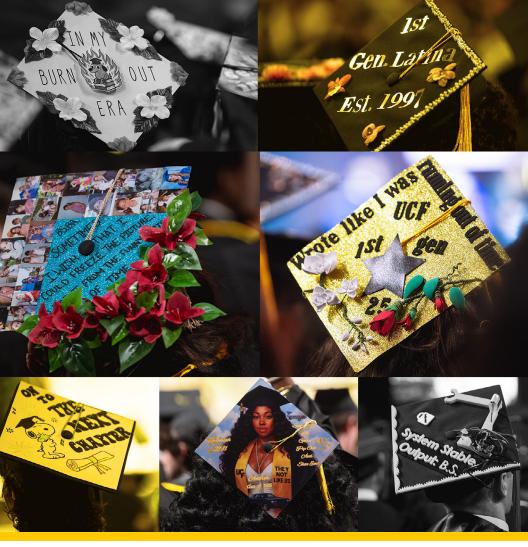
Map of Conference Hall
